ANNEX 1 TABLE OF MANDATORY CONDITIONS UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003

- 1.** That no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2.** That every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3.** Where one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001 or entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001.
- 4.** (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
 - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - i. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (a) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (b) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (d) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
(a) a holographic mark, or
(b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

8. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

9. The admission of children to the exhibition of any film is to be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the relevant film classification body or relevant licensing authority.

Licensing Act 2003 - Section 177a

The provision of entertainment consisting of the performance of live music and recorded music is not to be regarded as the provision of regulated entertainment provided:

- Music takes place on premises which are authorised by a premises licence or club premises certificate to be used for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises,
- At the time of the music, the premises are open for the purposes of being used for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises,
- If the music is amplified, it takes place in the presence of an audience of no more than 500 patrons, and
- The music takes place between 8am and 11pm on the same day.

Any condition of the premises licence or club premises certificate detailed below which relates to live music, recorded music or both does not have effect in relation to the music.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

Protection of children from harm

CH3 Entertainment for Children

1. Children under the age of 14 years shall not be permitted in the premises after 21.00 hours.

CH5 Entertainment's Unsuitable for Some Audiences

2. If any film is shown that has not been previously broadcast before 20.00 hours on Television, it will be subject to an appropriate age classification and children under the appropriate age will not be permitted in the premises when the film is shown

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Public Nuisance

PN1 Conduct of Premises

3. That the external drinking area shall not be used after 23.00 hours, and 22.30 hours on Sundays, and shall be cleared by 23.20 hours and 22.50 hours on Sundays.

4. That bottles and cans shall not be placed in the external collection points or bins between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours.

5. Clear legible notices are to be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

6. That a contact telephone number of the designated premises supervisor shall be displayed in a prominent place visible from the highway.

PN15 Windows and Doors

7. That all windows remain closed at all times and that all doors remain closed except during access and egress after 23.00 hours

PN21 Mini-cabs

8. That patrons are provided with facilities to order mini-cabs from within the premises.
